DUE TO THE CURRENT CORONAVIRUS COVID-19 PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY A TEMPORARY SUSPENSION OF THE OPEN MEETING ACTS TO ALLOW TELEPHONE OR VIDEOCONFERENCING PUBLIC MEETINGS HAS BEEN GRANTED BY GOVERNOR GREG ABBOTT. A TELECONFERENCE MEETING OF THE LINDALE CITY COUNCIL WAS CONDUCTED INSTEAD OF MEETING PROVIDING A PHYSICAL ACCESS TO THE PUBLIC. MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WERE ALLOWED TO PARTICIPATE BY JOINING A MEETING LIVE OR BY CALLING TO LISTEN LIVE.

MAYOR JEFF DAUGHERTY CALLED THE MEETING TO ORDER AT 6:00 P.M. HAVING ESTABLISHED A QUORUM.

COUNCIL MEMBERS PRESENT VIA TELEPHONE CONFERENCE: RICK THELEN, CLYDE HARPER, GINGER SIMS, BOB TARDIFF AND BRYAN SUMMERVILLE.

OTHERS PRESENT: CITY MANAGER, CAROLYN CALDWELL (IN PERSON), CITY SECRETARY, MICHELLE PHILLIPS (IN PERSON), FINANCIAL DIRECTOR, DAVID CRAFT (IN PERSON).

CAROLYN CALDWELL'S, OPENING STATEMENT TO MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC AND ANY CITIZENS ONLINE THAT WOULD LIKE TO SPEAK ON AN AGENDA ITEM, PLEASE STATE YOUR NAME AND AGENDA ITEM YOU WOULD LIKE TO ADDRESS. IF THERE ARE ANY CITIZENS THAT WOULD LIKE TO SPEAK ON CITIZEN TALK TIME STATE YOUR NAME.

C-1 DISCUSSION AND ACTION TO APPROVE A PROPOSED TAX RATE AND PROPOSED BUDGET FOR YEAR 2020-2021 AND SET A DATES FOR PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE AND PROPOSED BUDGET. THIS ITEM MOVED TO BOTTOM OF AGENDA AFTER WORKSHOP.

C-12 DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO CONTINUE OR EXTEND THE CITY OF LINDALE DECLARATION OF DISASTER DUE TO PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY. MAYOR DAUGHERTY STATED THE DECLARATION HAS BEEN EXTENDED FOR ANOTHER 30 DAYS DUE TO THE NUMBER OF COVID CASES AND HOSPITAL NUMBERS CONTINUE TO RISE. THE PICKERS PAVILION AND KINZIE COMMUNITY CENTER WILL CONTINUE TO REMAIN CLOSE. CAROLYN CALDWELL, CITY MANAGER, UPDATED ON CITY HALL, THE CITY IS CONTINUING PROTOCOL, EMPLOYEES ARE WEARING MASKS WHEN GOING INTO ANOTHER EMPLOYEES OFFICE. ANYONE COMING INTO CITY HALL IS ASKED TO WEAR A MASK. RICK THELEN MADE A MOTION TO RATIFY DECLARATION OF DISASTER UNTIL THE END OF THE MONTH. SECOND BY CLYDE HARPER. RECORD OF VOTE RICK THELEN FOR, CLYDE HARPER FOR, GINGER SIMS FOR, BOB TARDIFF FOR, AND BRYAN SUMMERVILLE FOR. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

C-11 DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING COVID-19 POLICY, PROCEDURES, ORDERS, UPDATES, COMMUNITY EVENTS AND CONSULT WITH CITY MEDICAL ADVISOR. MAYOR DAUGHERTY, INTRODUCED DR. WILSON, HE HAS BEEN A GREAT HELP TO THE CITY ON COVID-19 RELATED ISSUES. DR. WILSON STATED HE DOES CONSULTING FOR COVID-19 AND HE WOULD LIKE TO BE OF HELP TO LINDALE AS MUCH AS POSSIBLE. THERE SEEMS TO BE HOT SPOTS IN SMITH COUNTY AT CERTAIN BUSINESSES OR AFTER CERTAIN EVENTS. THERE IS A SPIKE AND SURGE OF CASES HERE. THE PATIENTS ARE YOUNGER AND THE CASES ARE MORE SEVERE. HE DISCUSSED THE SAFETY OF WEARING A FACE MASK. MAYOR INQUIRED ABOUT HOLDING OUTDOOR EVENTS IN LINDALE. DR. WILSON STATED THERE HAS TO BE A BALANCE AND WHAT YOUR GOALS ARE. UNFORTUNATELY, WE ARE ABOUT TO HEAD BACK INTO COLD AND FLU SEASON WITHOUT A VACCINE FOR THE CORONA VIRUS. THE CORONA VIRUS COULD COME BACK MUCH BIGGER. IT TAKES EVERYTHING ABOUT THE CORONA VIRUS, THE TREATMENT, MANAGEMENT, AND CONTROL. THERE IS A RISK. COUNCILMAN BOB TARDIFF ASKED ABOUT IMPORTANCE OF WEARING A MASK BY RESTAURANT EMPLOYEES WAITING ON CUSTOMERS AND HOLDING A 5K RUNNING EVENT. DR. WILSON STATED IT WOULD BE VERY DIFFICULT TO RUN A 5K WITH A MASK ON. IT WOULD NOT BE ADVISED ON THE RUNNERS STANDPOINT AND ON THE COVID STANDPOINT RUNNERS ARE VERY CLOSE TO EACH OTHER EXHALING A LOT OF AIR AROUND EACH OTHER AND THE PERSON NEXT TO YOU TAKING A BIG DEEP BREATH. ADDRESSING RESTAURANTS, IT'S IMPORTANT FOR AN EMPLOYEE SERVING FOOD AND INTERACTING WITH A CUSTOMERS TO WEAR A MASK. THIS ITEM WAS REVISITED: COUNCILMAN TARDIFF STATED BASED ON WHAT HE HEARD FROM DR. WILSON HAVING PICKER'S CURRENTLY CLOSED HE WOULD HATE TO SEE THEM APPROVE A RUN BASED ON WHAT THE DOCTOR SAID. CAROLYN CALDWELL, CITY MANAGER, STATED WE HAVE BEEN CANCELLING EVENTS 30 DAYS OUT AT PICKER'S PAVILION. THERE ARE 3 LARGE EVENTS

SCHEDULED AT PICKER'S: COUNTRYFEST, WINE FESTIVAL, AND VINTAGE MARKET DAYS. THE PROBLEM WITH WINE FESTIVAL AND VINTAGE MARKET THEY START ADVERTISING THEIR EVENTS 90 DAYS OUT. MAYOR DAUGHERTY, STATED IT'S AN AWKWARD TIME WE DON'T KNOW WHAT IS HAPPENING MONTH TO MONTH. HE KNOWS CAROLYN CALDWELL, CITY MANAGER, IS CONCERNED ABOUT TRYING TO HAVE ANY FESTIVALS DOWNTOWN OR ANYTHING ELSE BECAUSE OF THE OBVIOUS WE DON'T WANT TO DO ANYTHING TO CAUSE AN OUTBREAK OR AN ISSUE. THERE WILL BE A DISCUSSION ABOUT OPEN AIR EVENTS AND CAN WE PULL THAT OFF AND CAN WE DO IT RESPONSIBLY. WE WILL BE DISCUSSING THE RUN AGAIN. HE KNOWS COUNCILMAN TARDIFF HAS SOME CONCERN. NO ACTION.

C-2 DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO APPROVE REPUBLIC SERVICES, INC., NOTIFICATION OF 2.9% INCREASE IN SOLID WASTE COLLECTION AND APPROVE AN ORDINANCE ADJUSTING GARBAGE RATES. CAROLYN CALDWELL, CITY MANAGER, STATED, REPUBLIC SERVICES HAS THE OPTION IN THEIR CONTRACT TO RAISE THEIR RATES EACH YEAR. LAST YEAR THEY OPTED NOT TO RAISE THEIR RATES. CAROLYN CALDWELL, CITY MANAGER, RECOMMENDS WE APPROVE THE ORDINANCE RAISING THE RATES. GINGER SIMS MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE REPUBLIC SERVICES, INC. NOTIFICATION OF 2.9 % INCREASE AND APPROVE ORDINANCE 11-2020 AMENDING THE GARBAGE RATE BY 2.9% EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 2020. SECOND BY CLYDE HARPER. RECORD OF VOTE RICK THELEN FOR, CLYDE HARPER FOR, GINGER SIMS FOR, BOB TARDIFF FOR, AND BRYAN SUMMERVILLE FOR. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

C-3 DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO REGARDING COMMUNITY CENTER, BUILD/REBUILD, CLOSURE DATE, DESIGN/LAYOUT AND OVERALL PROJECT. COUNCILMAN RICK THELEN, SPOKE ON OPTIONS FOR COMMUNITY CENTER. THEY MET WITH JERRY ALEXANDER AND HE RECOMMENDS RENOVATIONS TO THE BUILDING ALONG WITH SOME ADDITIONS. BRYAN SUMMERVILLE, STATED HE WOULD LIKE TO SEE AN INDUSTRIAL KITCHEN. THIS WOULD REQUIRE A FIRE SPRINKLER SYSTEM TO BE INSTALLED. THE BUILDING IS IN GOOD SHAPE BUT NEEDS A LOT OF REDESIGN. IF WE COULD GET THE COMMUNITY CENTER REMODEL DONE FOR AROUND \$300,000. MAYOR DAUGHERTY STATED HE IS FAVOR OF IMPROVING THE BUILDING BUT HE WANTS TO SEE A NEW BUILDING WHEN LOOKING AT IT. GINGER SIMS, WOULD LIKE TO SEE AN INDUSTRIAL KITCHEN. SHE IS VERY MUCH IN FAVOR OF IMPROVEMENTS. CAROLYN CALDWELL, STATED THE ENTIRE BUILDING IS ABOUT 3,000 SQ. FEET. THE BIGGEST PART OF THE BUILDING BEING USED IS THE LARGE CONFERENCE ROOM WHICH IS ABOUT 1,500 SQUARE FEET. THE DISCUSSION HAS BEEN GUTTING THE ENTIRE INSIDE BUILDING, REMOVING THE KITCHEN, RESTROOMS, AND WORK ROOMS AND OPENING IT UP TO A 3,000 SQUARE FOOT BUILDING ON THE INSIDE WITH HIGH CEILINGS ALL THE WAY UP THROUGHOUT BUILDING, THEN ADDING KITCHEN, BATHROOM OFF THAT BUILDING WITH AN ENTRANCE. SHE CAN MOVE FORWARD IF THIS IS THE DIRECTION COUNCIL WOULD LIKE TO DO, SHE CAN HAVE JERRY ALEXANDER DRAW UP SOME PLANS. CITY EMPLOYEE'S CAN GUT THE BUILDING ON THE INSIDE. BOB TARDIFF STATED HE IS IN FAVOR OF NEW A NEW KITCHEN. THE ONLY CONCERN WITH OPEN CEILING NOISE IF WE GO WITH FOAM CEILING TO HELP DEAD END THE SOUND IN THE BUILDING. NO MOTION. CAROLYN CALDWELL, CITY MANAGER WILL MOVE FORWARD WITH PRICING AND DESIGN OF RENOVATIONS. MAYOR REQUESTED COUNCILWOMAN GINGER SIMS HELP WORK ON THE DESIGN OF COMMUNITY CENTER.

C-4 DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO APPROVE THE LOCATION OF NOVEMBER 3, 2020 ELECTION FOR CITY CHARTER AMENDMENTS. CAROLYN CALDWELL, CITY MANAGER STATED KAREN NELSON, SMITH COUNTY ELECTIONS OFFICER, IS HAVING A DIFFICULT TIME FINDING A SPOT TO HOLD ELECTIONS THIS YEAR. SHE CAME AND LOOKED AT THE COMMUNITY CENTER. THE CITY IS REQUIRED TO HAVE OUR ELECTIONS INSIDE THE CITY LIMITS BECAUSE OF OUR CHARTER ELECTION BEING ON THE BALLOT. THERE IS A MANDATE BY THE CITY TO HAVE THE FACILITY CLOSED DUE TO THE COVID-19 VIRUS. WE HAVE HAD TO CANCEL A LOT OF EVENTS THERE, BUT THIS IS A MANDATE AND WE HAVE NO CHOICE BUT TO HOLD OUR ELECTION THERE. MAYOR DAUGHERTY STATED THIS IS AN IMPORTANT ELECTION FOR ALL OF US AND HE WOULD LIKE TO SEE THE COMMUNITY CENTER LOOK IN PRISTINE SHAPE AND CLEANED UP OUTSIDE FOR THE ELECTION. RICK THELEN MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE SMITH COUNTY ELECTION COMMISSION TO HOLD THE CITY CHARTER ELECTION AND PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION AT THE COMMUNITY CENTER FOR NOVEMBER ELECTIONS THIS YEAR. SECOND BY BRYAN SUMMERVILLE. RECORD OF VOTE RICK THELEN FOR, CLYDE HARPER FOR, GINGER SIMS FOR, BOB TARDIFF FOR, AND BRYAN SUMMERVILLE FOR. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

C-5 DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO APPROVE ADDENDUM TWO TO LEASE AGREEMENT WITH THE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE FOR THE KINZIE HOUSE. CAROLYN CALDWELL, CITY MANAGER, STATED THE ADDENDUM TO THE CONTRACT IS BECAUSE OF THE REDUCTION IN FUNDS IN THE HOTEL/MOTEL FUND. WE HAD TO REDUCE THE TOURISM FUND BY \$100,000 WHICH PART OF THAT WAS REDUCING THE AMOUNT WE PAY TO THE CHAMBER, INCLUDING THE RENT THEY PAY. THE ADDENDUM IS \$3,600 FOR FACILITY MAINTENANCE, AND \$31,100.00 FOR THEIR ASSISTANCE WITH TOURISM. BOB TARDIFF MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE FOURTH ADDENDUM TO CHAMBER OF COMMERCE AMENDING FACILITY AND ADMINISTRATION COST FOR A TERM OF ONE-YEAR. SECOND BY GINGER SIMS. RECORD OF VOTE RICK THELEN FOR, CLYDE HARPER FOR, GINGER SIMS FOR, BOB TARDIFF FOR, AND BRYAN SUMMERVILLE FOR. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

C-7 DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO APPROVE THE ALLIANCE RECORDING SYSTEM. MAINTENANCE. DAVID CRAFT, FINANCIAL DIRECTOR, STATED THE ALLIANCE RECORDING SYSTEM IS USED BY THE POLICE DEPARTMENT TO RECORD PHONES AND POLICE RADIO TRAFFIC. THE CITY HAS USED THEM FOR MANY YEARS AND HE RECOMMENDS THE GOLD PLAN. RICK THELEN MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE \$5,821.16 FOR THE GOLD PLAN FOR THE ALLIANCE RECORDER. SECOND BY CLYDE HARPER. RECORD OF VOTE RICK THELEN FOR, CLYDE HARPER FOR, GINGER SIMS FOR, BOB TARDIFF FOR, AND BRYAN SUMMERVILLE FOR. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

C-6 DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO APPROVE ADDENDUM TWO TO LEASE AGREEMENT WITH THE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE FOR THE KINZIE HOUSE. CAROLYN CALDWELL, CITY MANAGER, STATED THIS IS PART OF THE CHAMBER LEASE AGREEMENT FOR \$6,000 IN RENT FOR THE KINZIE HOUSE. SHE IS ASKING TO DO A ONE YEAR AGREEMENT AND REDUCE RENT TO \$1.00 DURING THIS TIME OF COVID-19. BOB TARDIFF MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE SECOND ADDENDUM TO THE LINDALE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE KINZIE HOUSE LEASE AGREEMENT DATED JUNE 2011. SECOND BY GINGER SIMS. RECORD OF VOTE RICK THELEN FOR, CLYDE HARPER FOR, GINGER SIMS FOR, BOB TARDIFF FOR, AND BRYAN SUMMERVILLE FOR. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

C-8 DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO APPROVE CREATIVE SWITCHING DESIGN MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT FOR THE MITEL PHONE SYSTEM. DAVID CRAFT, FINANCIAL DIRECTOR, RECOMMENDS 3 YEAR ANNUAL GOLD CARE PLAN. RICK THELEN MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE MITEL PHONE SYSTEM GOLD THREE YEAR MAINTENANCE PLAN FOR \$19,714.20 AND SERVICE WITH 24/7 EMERGENCY ADD-ON FOR \$1,500 A YEAR. SECOND BY BOB TARDIFF. RECORD OF VOTE RICK THELEN FOR, CLYDE HARPER FOR, GINGER SIMS FOR, BOB TARDIFF FOR, AND BRYAN SUMMERVILLE FOR. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

C-9 DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO APPROVE AN AMOUNT TO TRANSFER TO THE LEDC FOR FUTURE INFRASTRUCTURE NEEDS. CAROLYN CALDWELL, CITY MANAGER, STATED LEDC IS DOING ALOT OF INFRASTRUCTURE WORK THROUGHOUT THE CITY. IN 2016, LEDC GAVE THE CITY \$700,000 TO DO INFRASTRUCTURE WORK. THIS YEAR WE DID NOT DO ALL OF OUR CAPITAL EXPENDITURES BECAUSE WE WENT ON A FREEZE DUE TO THE COVID. WE ARE ENDING OUR YEAR SHE WOULD LIKE TO TRANSFER OVER A MILLION DOLLARS TO LEDC FOR FUTURE INFRASTRUCTURE. RICK THELEN MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE TRANSFER OF ONE MILLION TO THE LEDC FOR FUTURE INFRASTRUCTURE NEEDS. FUNDS SHALL BE RESTRICTED FOR FUTURE INFRASTRUCTURE. SECOND BY BRYAN SUMMERVILLE. RECORD OF VOTE RICK THELEN FOR, CLYDE HARPER FOR, GINGER SIMS FOR, BOB TARDIFF FOR, AND BRYAN SUMMERVILLE FOR. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

C-10 DISCUSSION AND ACTION TO APPROVE CARES ACT FUND EXPENDITURES. DAVID CRAFT, FINANCIAL DIRECTOR, STATED HE IS SEEKING APPROVAL TO PURCHASE 10 NEW LAPTOPS FROM DELL. THIS PURCHASE WOULD ENABLE US TO MAKE LAPTOPS AVAILABLE TO OUR OTHER BOARDS SUCH AS PLANNING AND ZONING AND BOARD OF ADJUSTMENTS FOR THEM TO CONDUCT VIRTUAL MEETINGS SO THE CITY BUSINESS CONTINUES TO OPERATE SMOOTHLY AS SOCIAL DISTANCING CONTINUES DUE TO THE COVID 19 PANADEMIC. THE TOTAL PURCHASE IS \$15,213.30 THIS MONEY WILL BE SPENT OUT OF THE CARES ACT FUND AND IS PART OF THE 25% ALLOWED FOR TECHNOLOGY. WE HAVE LEARNED THAT THE REQUIREMENT TO SPEND 75% ON CERTAIN ITEMS AND 25 % ON OTHERS IS NOT CALCULATED TILL THE END OF THE FUND DATE WHICH IS DECEMBER 30, 2020. ANOTHER THING WE ARE LOOKING AT ON THE CARES ACT FUND IS PAYING DR. WILSON FOR CONTRACT CONSULTING ON COVID-19. BOB TARDIFF MADE A MOTION TO NEGOTIATE A CONTRACT WITH DR. WILSON AND APPROVE \$15,213.60 TO BE SPENT FROM THE CARES ACT FUND FOR THE PURCHASE OF NEW LAPTOPS. SECOND BY CLYDE HARPER. RECORD OF VOTE RICK THELEN FOR, CLYDE HARPER FOR, GINGER SIMS FOR, BOB TARDIFF FOR, AND BRYAN SUMMERVILLE FOR. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

C-13 DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO APPROVE COUNCILMAN CLYDE HARPER ABSENCE FROM THE JULY 21, 2020 REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING AS AN EXCUSED ABSENCE. GINGER SIMS MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE COUNCILMAN CLYDE HARPER ABSENCE JULY 21, 2020 REGULAR MEETING AS AN EXCUSED ABSENCE. SECOND BY BRYAN SUMMERVILLE. RECORD OF VOTE RICK THELEN FOR, CLYDE HARPER FOR, GINGER SIMS FOR, BOB TARDIFF FOR, AND BRAYAN SUMMERVILLE FOR. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

D. WORKSHOP FOR 2020-2021 BUDGET YEAR. COUNCIL ENTERED INTO WORKSHOP. ITEMS DISCUSSED; SETTING THE TAX RATE. CAROLYN CALDWELL, CITY MANAGER, STATED TAX NUMBERS ARE IN AND SHE NEEDS DIRECTION FROM THE COUNCIL ON THE BUDGET. THIS IS A TOUGH YEAR AND A LOT OF PEOPLE ARE UNEMPLOYED AND EVERYBODY HAS UNCERTAINTY ABOUT WHERE WE ARE HEADED AND WHAT IS GOING ON. TAX RATE CAME IN AND SHE KNOWS COUNCIL IS USE TO HER SAYING THE EFFECTIVE AND ROLLBACK RATE BUT THEY HAVE CHANGED THE LANGUAGE AND THERE IS NO LONGER AN EFFECTIVE RATE AND NO LONGER A ROLLBACK RATE DUE TO SENATE BILL 2. IT IS NOW NO NEW TAX RATE AND THE VOTER APPROVED TAX RATE. THE NO NEW TAX RATE FOR THIS YEAR IS .45591, WHICH IS BELOW OUR CURRENT TAX RATE OF .47090. THE VOTER TAX RATE IS .468438, WHICH IS BELOW OUR CURRENT TAX RATE .47090. THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN YOUR NO NEW TAX RATE AND YOUR VOTER APPROVED TAX RATE IS \$50,000 TO THE BUDGET. IF YOU WENT WITH THE VOTER APPROVED TAX RATE, THE CITY WOULD GET AN ADDITIONAL \$50,000. SHE ASKED COUNCIL FOR DIRECTION ON BUDGET. DISCUSSION AMONG COUNCIL MEMBERS REGARDING TAX RATE. CAROLYN ASK FOR DIRECTION ON BUDGET SO SHE CAN GET PROPOSED BUDGET OUT AND SET UP HEARINGS FOR THE BUDGET AT THE NEXT MEETING. RICK THELEN PREFERRED NO TAX RATE AND GINGER SIMS AGREED. CAROLYN CALDWELL, STATED SHE WILL BE MAKING SOME MOVEMENTS ON A FEW LINE ITEMS ON THE BUDGET. SHE WILL NOTIFY COUNCIL OF THE LINE ITEMS SHE WILL BE MOVING AROUND. COUNCIL WORKSHOP ENDS 7:28 P.M.
